Education Coordinator - Job Announcement

The Cahoon Museum of American Art is looking for a part-time Education Coordinator for our get smART! program, the purpose of which is to educate and get children excited about the visual arts.

Coordinating the 10-year-old get smArt! program, which is currently funded by JB-S Enterprises, includes the following responsibilities:

The responsibilities include:

1. Designing and printing a one-sided flier, describing each new exhibit to teachers. The flier should include 2 or 3 pictures from the exhibition, along with information on how to sign up for a class field trip to the Museum. Fliers are to be delivered to elementary and middle schools in the area, with enough fliers printed for *each* classroom teacher.
2. Planning a tour for each exhibition in the main gallery, lasting about 45 minutes, and appropriate to the age group attending. The tour should include information about the Museum itself, rules of good museum conduct, and allow for plenty of feedback from students!
3. Designing and printing a 2-sided student hand-out, reviewing the exhibition, and including related information and/or vocabulary and/or fun facts. The hand-out should include further pictures from the exhibition, and may include others if they are useful to illustrate the theme.
4. Working with the Director to discuss ways of expanding the program, which may include hands-on workshops, and helping to identify possible funding sources for that expansion.

The coordinator position will be supervised by the director and will pay \$12.50 per hour. For further information, please contact:
